- 1. PI refers :-
  - (a) The Gazette of India dt 28 Dec 2016 regarding the Right of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (copy att).
  - (b) Govt of India, MH & FW, Department of Health & Family Welfare EHS Section letter No 4-24/96-C&P/CGHS(P)/EHS dt 07 May 2018 (copy att).
  - (c) Govt of India, MoD (DoESW) letter No 18(77)/2017/WE/D(Res-I) dated 18 Sep 2018 (copy att).
- 2. A large No of queries are being recd at this HQ regarding auth of ECHS membership to disabled married son under Persons with Disability (PWD). Person with Disabilities Act 2016 was implemented wef 18 Sep 2018 vide Govt orders mentioned at Para 1 (c) above. PWD Act 2016 authorise only unmarried disabled son to avail ECHS benefits.
- 3. It is further clarified that PWD Act 2016 annuls PWD Act 1995. However Para **102**. (1) & (2) of Gazette of India dated 28 Dec 2016 clearly reads that benefits extended under PWD Act 1995 to existing members will continue, even under PWD Act 2016 irrespective of category (Married /unmarried).
- 4. Anyone joining scheme after implementation of PWD Act 2016 will be purely guided by eligibility criteria as mentioned in PWD Act 2016, subject to applicant meeting the income criteria Rs 9000/- pm plus DA.
- 5. This office letter No B/49701-PR/AG/ECHS/2020 dated 07 Jul 2020 may pl be treated as cancelled.

The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 27th December, 2016, and is hereby published for general information:—

## THE RIGHTS OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES ACT, 2016

(No. 49 of 2016)

[27th December, 2016]

An Act to give effect to the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Whereas the United Nations General Assembly adopted its Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities on the 13th day of December, 2006;

And whereas the aforesaid Convention lays down the following principles for empowerment of persons with disabilities,—

- (a) respect for inherent dignity, individual autonomy including the freedom to make one's own choices, and independence of persons;
  - (b) non-discrimination:
  - (c) full and effective participation and inclusion in society;
- (d) respect for difference and acceptance of persons with disabilities as part of human diversity and humanity:

- (l) salaries, allowances and other conditions of services of the State Commissioner under sub-section (3) of section 79;
- (m) the salaries, allowances and conditions of services of officers and staff of the State Commissioner under sub-section (3) of section 79;
- (n) the composition and manner of appointment of experts in the advisory committee under sub-section (7) of section 79;
- (o) the form, manner and content of annual and special reports to be prepared and submitted by the State Commissioner under sub-section (3) of section 83;
- (p) the fee or remuneration to be paid to the Special Public Prosecutor under sub-section (2) of section 85;
- (q) the manner of constitution of State Fund for persons with disabilities under sub-section (I), and the manner of utilisation and management of State Fund under sub-section (2) of section 88;
- (r) the form for preparation of accounts of the State Fund for persons with disabilities under sub-section (3) of section 88.
- (3) Every rule made by the State Government under this Act shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made, before each House of the State Legislature where it consists of two Houses, or where such State Legislature consists of one House, before that House.

Repeal and savings.

102. (1) The Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunity Protection of Rights and 1 of 1996. Full Participation) Act, 1995 is hereby repealed.

Notwithstanding the repeal of the said Act, anything done or any action taken under the said Act, shall be deemed to have been done or taken under the corresponding provisions of this Act.

### OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Eligibility of Permanently Disabled Unmarried Son of a CGHS Beneficiary to avail CGHS facility - Reg.

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Ministry's Office Memoranda of even number dated 31.05.2007, 29.08.2007 and 02.08.2010 vide which the entitlement of the son of a CGHS beneficiary beyond the age of 25 years was conveyed. As per the two Office Memoranda under reference, it was indicated that an unmarried son of a CGHS beneficiary surfering from any permanent disability of any kind (physical or mental) will be entitled to CGHS facility even after attaining the age of 25 years.

2. Since then this Ministry is in receipt of several representations for inclusion of more conditions in view of modification to the PwD Act, 1995 by "The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (Act No. 49 of 2016)" as notified by M/o Law and Justice, Govt. of India on 27.12.2016. The matter has been reviewed by the Ministry and it is now decided that for the purpose of extending the CGHS benefits to dependent unmarried son of CGHS beneficiary beyond 25 years of age, the definition of 'Permanent Disability' shall include the following conditions:

### L Physical disability:

### A. Locomotor disability including

- a) Leprosy cured person-suffering from loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity or suffering from manifest deformity and paresis or having extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which preyents him/her from gainful occupation
- b) Cerebral palsy caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain usually occurring before, during or immediately after birth.
- c) Dwarfism- a medical genetic pudition resulting in an adult heigh of 147 cms or less;
- d) Muscular dystrophy- a group of hereditary genetic muscle diseases characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness
- e) Acid attack victims disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing acid or similar corrosive substance

### B. Visual impairment:

- a) Blindness where a person has any of the following conditions after best correction:
  - (i) Total absence of sight or
  - (ii) Visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200(Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction
  - (iii) Limitation of field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree
- b) "Low vision" means any of the following conditions:
  - (i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 up to 3/60 up to 10/200

(Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree

### C. Herring Impairment V

- (a) "deaf" means persons having 70 db hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- (b) "hard of hearing" means persons having 60 db to 70 db hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- 1). "Speech and Language disability" permanent disability arising out of conditions such as Laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neuronal causes.
- II. Intellectual disability characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reason ng, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behavior, which cover a range of every day, social and practical skills, including, social and practical skills, including.
  - (a) "Specific language disabilities"— a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do the mathematical calculations and includes conditions such as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia

(b) "Autism spectrum disorder" a neuro-developmental disorder typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviour.

"Mental behaviour "Mental illness"- a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgement, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation.

### IV. Mental Retardation

V. Disability caused due to

(a) Chronic neurological conditions such as

(i) Multiple Sclerosis

(ii) Parkinson's disease

(b) Blood disorder

(i) Haemophila

(ii) Thalassemia V

(ii ) Sickle Cell Disease

VI. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above disabilities)- including deaf blindness

3. Bench Mark Disability- unmarried permanently disabled and financially dependent sons of CGHS beneficiaries suffering 40% or more of one or more disabilities as certified by a Medical Board shall be eligible to avail CGHS facilities even after attaining the age of 25 years.

4. This OM will be effective from the date of its issue.
